

Pre-Registration for Healthcare Facilities Licensed By the Division of Quality Assurance

In order to provide immunizations to all these target groups, the collaboration of healthcare providers, local health departments, community immunizers and others will be necessary. The Wisconsin Division of Public Health (DPH) is requesting the participation of healthcare facilities in immunizing the target group of healthcare workers and patients/residents in other target groups, when appropriate.

Healthcare workers are defined as those persons who work within a healthcare facility as employees, volunteers or contract staff.

Healthcare Facilities are defined as all entities licensed by the Division of Quality Assurance.

Only those healthcare facilities listed above that meet the following criteria should preregister:

1. The facility already provides seasonal influenza vaccine to its staff on an annual basis (not using a community immunizer)
2. The facility has the cold storage capability to store the H1N1 vaccine
3. The facility can utilize a minimum of 100 doses of the H1N1 vaccine (without reserving the second dose).

Pre-Registration allows DPH to have the infrastructure in place and ready to be deployed, once the CDC and DPH determine that the H1N1 Vaccine Immunization Program should be implemented. Pre-Registration will give DPH the Contact Information, SHIP TO information and estimated amounts of H1N1 vaccine that is initially being requested.
